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Books of Enoch

- Found in writings as old as 400 BC.
- One Text, The Book of The Secrets of Enoch, claimed to exist in Russia (Slavonic, translated from Greek) for 1200 years, before translated to English in 1896
- Other fragments of same text found in dead sea scrolls, Aramic, Greek, Latin, was proof that The Book of Enoch was known by early Jews and Christians

Chapter 7—The Second Heaven

1 And those men took me and <u>led me up on to the second heaven</u>, and showed me darkness, greater than earthly darkness, and there I saw prisoners hanging, watched, awaiting the great and boundless judgment, and these angels (spirits) were dark-looking, more than earthly darkness, and incessantly making weeping through all hours.

2 And I said to the men who were with me: Wherefore are these incessantly tortured? They answered me: <u>These are God's apostates</u>, who obeyed not <u>God's commands</u>, but took counsel with their own will, and turned away with their prince, who also (is) fastened on the fifth heaven.

Chapter 7—The Second Heaven

3 And I felt great pity for them, and they saluted me, and said to me: Man of God, pray for us to the Lord; and I answered to them: Who am I, a mortal man, that I should pray for angels (spirits)?

Chapter 10,

1 And those two men led me up on to the Northern side, and showed me there a very terrible place, and (there were) all manner of tortures in that place: cruel darkness and unillumined gloom, and there is no light there, but murky fire constantly flaming aloft, and (there is) a fiery river coming forth,

3 And those men said to me: This place, O Enoch, is prepared for those who dishonour God, who on earth practice sin against nature, which is child-corruption after the sodomitic fashion, magic-making, enchantments and devilish witchcrafts, and who boast of their wicked deeds, stealing, lies, calumnies, envy, rancour, fornication, murder, and who, accursed, steal the souls of men, who, seeing the poor take away their goods and themselves wax rich, injuring them for other men's goods;

Chapter 10,

3.....who being able to satisfy the empty,

made the hungering to die; being able to clothe, stripped the naked;

and who knew not their creator, and bowed to the soulless (and lifeless) gods, who cannot see nor hear, vain gods,

(who also) built hewn images and bow down to unclean handiwork,

for all these is prepared this place among these, for eternal inheritance.

Chapter 11

1 Those men took me, and led me up on to the fourth heaven, and showed me all the successive goings, <u>and all the rays of the light of sun and moon.</u>

How many times (at least) is the Prison House 'Opened'? (and prisoners released.

1-Enoch records at Jesus Death.

• And where do they stand after?

<u>2-DC records at Jesus return (beginning of Millenium)</u>, resurrection of the JUST. (DC 85)

• And where do they stand?

3-DC and Revelation 10: <u>at END of Millennium</u>—ALL (dead) come forth. This is the last day, the final judgement. (DC 76)

• And where do they stand?

God's 'angry' about what?

Resurrection

Abinadi and Alma both speak of Resurrection, and specifically a First Resurrection, but note, they use the terms differently:

- <u>Abinadi</u> uses 'first resurrection' as those who died before Christ to be resurrected at the time when Christ is resurrected.
- Alma clarifies saying 'while some have called it a 'First Resurrection' this doesn't mean the same as the 'First Resurrection' at the time when Christ returns when all the good in Christ are alive.

Resurrection--Abinadi

Mosiah 8

55 And there cometh a resurrection, even a <u>first resurrection</u>; yea, even a resurrection of those that have been, and who are, and who shall be, even until the resurrection of Christ: for so shall he be called.

56 And now, the resurrection of all the prophets, <u>and all those that have</u> <u>believed in their words</u>, or all those that have kept the commandments of God, shall come forth in the first resurrection; therefore, they are the first resurrection.

Resurrection--Abinadi

Mosiah 8:

57 They are raised to dwell with God who has redeemed them: thus they have eternal life through Christ, who has broken the bands of death.

58 <u>And these are those who have part in the first resurrection; and these are they that have died before Christ came, in their ignorance, not having salvation declared unto them.</u>

Question: When do these events occur?

- Zion (mount Zion) is established.
- Enoch's City returns to earth.
- The Lord Returns to earth in Glory!
- The righteous souls in paradise are resurrected (return with Jesus) and live on the earth again!
- ...and, from DC 85: 28 (at the second Trumpet) when do some get released from the Prison house?

QUESTION:

(and here is the key point): When is the Resurrection of the "Just"

And, when is the Resurrection of the "UnJust?"

Understanding four terms is essential:

The Resurrection of the Just is:

- People from Heaven, live ON THE EARTH.
- People who followed Jesus, baptized, covenant.
- When Enoch's city returns.
- It starts the "Millennium"
- Also referred to as "The First Resurrection."
- When <mark>Jesus reigns ON EARTH</mark>.

The Resurrection of the UnJust:

- At the END of the Millenium.
- Unrepentant people.
- People in Prison House (Hell).
- They <u>did not take part</u> in life on earth during Miillennium.
- They now come forth.
- This is the Second Resurrection, or the LAST and FINAL resurrection.

The understanding of "Glory"

- Glory, is defined by DC 90 as 'light and truth.'
- •Glory is Understanding, experiencing Light and Truth about God.
- Not a physical place so much as a condition of understanding, leading to transformation.

Eternity.

- The state of life after Final Judgement.
- Also describes experiencing his fullness at any time because there can be no time where God is.
- Time doesn't exist in the Millennium. Angel announces 'time no longer.'
- Eternity and the Millennium are not the same.

Section 76 is <u>a description of Joseph Smith and Sidney Rigdon's</u> <u>vision</u> they beheld upon inquiry regarding John 5:29.

"...speaking of the resurrection of the dead, concerning those who shall hear the voice of the Son of man, and shall come forth; they who have done good in the resurrection of the just, and they who have done evil in the resurrection of the unjust."

-John 5:29

Happily, the Book of Mormon and Doctrine and Covenants tell the same story. We've just held a paradigm to see it differently.

And ye shall have good rewarded unto you again; for that which ye do send out, shall return unto you again, and be restored; therefore the word restoration, more fully condemneth the sinner, and justifieth him not at all.

5e they are they <u>who are the church of the Firstborn</u>

- The Firstborn return with Christ at His coming in Glory.
- When does he return?
- (Answer, <u>beginning</u> of Millennium)

5g...who have received of his fullness, and of his glory

- Have received fullness of his light and truth—i.e. glory
- not a <u>place</u> but a <u>condition</u>

5k these are they whom he shall bring with him when

<u>he shall come in the clouds of heaven</u>

When does Jesus return? Beginning of Millennium.

...to reign on the earth over his people;

When does Jesus reign over the earth? Beginning of Millennium.

5n <u>these are they who are come unto Mount Zion</u>, and unto the <u>city of the living God</u> the heavenly place, the holiest of all

Q. When is Zion?A. During the Millennium

50... to the general assembly and church of Enoch

Q. When does Enoch's church return?A. Beginning of Millennium.

5l these are they who shall <mark>have part in the first </mark> <mark>resurrection</mark>

First Resurrection IS THE Ressurection of the Just, starting the Millenium, not Eternity.

5m these are they who <mark>shall come forth in the resurrection of the just</mark>

Q. When is the resurrection of the 'Just?'

A. Beginning of Millennium

5r these are they whose bodies are celestial

So, what description is given to these people? Celestial

This means that there will be people alive during the Millennium that can and have dwelt in the presence of God, now alive on earth.

<mark>whose glory differs </mark>from that of the <mark>church of the</mark> Firstborn

Glory is Light and Truth--i.e. not a place, but a difference between the amount of light and truth they have received (the Spirit) from the Father. Description of people called "TERRESTRIAL" they who are the spirits of men kept in prison, whom the Son visited, and preached the gospel unto them, that they might be judged according to men in the flesh,

(1 Pet 3:18, 1 Pet 4:6).

(DC 85:28 describes those who were prisoners released in the first resurrection, when the second trump sounds. Christ claims these as his. Also, Gen 7:64 describes the prison house captives being released at the time of Christ's death and stand on the right hand of God)

...Wherefore they are bodies terrestrial, and not bodies celestial

Since these are described as ones who stand on the right hand of God, after a previous time in the prison house. This makes clear their state is during the Millennium.

...Wherefore they are bodies terrestrial, and not bodies celestial

This means that there are those resurrected who can not stand in the presence of God, because they have not yet received the Gift of the Holy Ghost in the flesh (yet). They can abide in the presence of The Son of God, (defined as God who has taken on flesh).

7d these are they who are thrust down to hell

Recall Rev 20:14 that <u>hell is cast into the lake of fire</u> <u>after</u> the last resurrection, the second death.

If this description is of the Telestial world after the final judgment, then it would be a scriptural conflict since "Hell" will not exist then.)

Description of people called "TELESTIAL" 7e these are they who shall not be redeemed from the Devil, until the last resurrection until the Lord, even Christ the Lamb, shall have finished his work;

NOTICE: these are to be redeemed at the LAST RESURRECTION.

- Q. When is that
- A. End of the Millenium

7f... for they shall be heirs of salvation

Salvation has to come at FINAL judgement, therefore this is a description DURING THE MILLENNIUM.

7n last of all, these all are they who will not be gathered with the saints, to be caught up unto the church of the Firstborn, and received into the cloud (..first resurrection)

7r...are cast down to hell and <mark>suffer</mark> the wrath of Almighty God <mark>until the fullness of times</mark>

when Christ shall have subdued all enemies under his feet, and <u>shall have</u> perfected his work, when he shall deliver up the kingdom and present it <mark>unto the Father spotless</mark>....

(this happens at beginning of last resurrection according to verse 7e above)

7v for they shall be judged according to their works; and every man shall receive according to his own works, and his own dominion, in the mansions which are prepared, and they shall be servants of the Most High, but where God and Christ dwell they cannot come, worlds without end.

Speaking of the Sons of Perdition who remain

• Note that the celestial, terrestrial, and telestial are descriptions of people living IN THE MILLENIUM AT THE RESURRECTION OF THE JUST!

- What of the books is called the 'Fullness of the Gospel?' It mentions nothing about celestial, terrestrial, telestial.
- Did Jesus not read DC 76 when he said you will stand on my left or right? Then why all this talk of 'glories?'
- Glories are light and truth, not places in the universe
 - Read the context in which they are described.
 - Celestial are people who came out of heaven with Jesus, they have been transformed
 - Terrestrial are on the earth
 - Telestial are in prison house. Also called 'Hell.' If they are in Hell, and Hell is cast into the lake of fire (i.e. no more), then when do they occupy Hell?
 - The final state of the souls of man is to dwell in the Kingdom or not.

4e the only ones on whom the second death shall have any power; yea, verily,

Notice that the 2nd death (i.e. final separation) is described ONLY for Sons of Perdition

the only ones who shall not be redeemed in the due time of the Lord, after the sufferings of his wrath;

Notice that these are the only ones who are not redeemed--i.e. Brought back to the Father.

4f for all the rest shall be brought forth by the resurrection of the dead,

Everyone else is redeemed after Millennium, STANDS ON RIGHT HAND OF GOD but many will suffer the 1000 years in the prison house.

76:4h that <mark>through him all might be saved, whom the</mark> <mark>Father had put into his power</mark>, and made by him;

who glorifies the Father, <mark>and saves all the works of</mark> <mark>his hands, except those sons of perdition</mark>,

who deny the Son after the Father has revealed him;

Book of Mormon describes Devil and his Angels "filthy still"

<u>2 Nephi 6:3</u>8

And assuredly, as the Lord liveth, for the Lord God hath spoken it, and it is his eternal word, which can not pass away, that they who are righteous shall be righteous still, and **they who are filthy shall be filthy still**;

38 Wherefore, they who are filthy are the devil and his angels;

40 And they shall go away into everlasting fire, prepared for them; and their torment is as a lake of fire and brimstone, whose flames ascendeth up for ever and ever; and has no end.

Alma 5:37 Therefore I say unto you, The time shall come, yea, and it shall be **at the last day**, **that he who is filthy, shall remain in his filthiness**.

Book of Mormon describes Devil and his Angels "filthy still"

2 Nephi 6:21

And **our spirits must have become like unto him**, and **we become devils, angels to a devil**, to be **shut out from the presence of our God**, and to remain with the father of lies, in misery, like unto himself;

Jacob 2:65

And loose yourselves from the pains of hell, that ye may not become angels to the devil, to be cast into that lake of fire and brimstone, which is the second death.

Mosiah 11:135 And then will I confess unto them, that I never knew them; and they shall depart into everlasting fire, prepared for the devil and his angels.
When is the left hand/right hand? DC 28

28:6a And again, verily, verily I say unto you, that when the thousand years are ended, and men again begin to deny their God, then will I spare the earth but for a little season;

28:6b and the end shall come, and the heaven and the earth shall be consumed, and pass away, and there shall be a new heaven and a new earth;

28:6c for all old things shall pass away, and all things shall become new, even the heaven and the earth, and all the fullness thereof, both men and beasts, the fowls of the air, and the fishes of the sea;

When is the left hand/right hand? DC 28

28:6d and not one hair, neither mote, shall be lost, for it is the workmanship of mine hand.

28:7a But, behold, verily I say unto you, Before the earth shall pass away, Michael, mine archangel, shall sound his trump, and then shall all the dead awake, for their graves shall be opened, and they shall come forth; yea, even all;

28:7b and the righteous shall be gathered on my right hand unto eternal life; and the wicked on my left hand will I be ashamed to own before the Father;

When is the left hand/right hand? DC 28

28:7c wherefore I will say unto them, Depart from me ye cursed into everlasting fire, prepared for the Devil and his angels.

28:8a And now, behold, I say unto you, Never at any time, have I declared from my own mouth that they should return, for where I am they can not come, for they have no power;

28:8b but remember that all my judgments are not given unto men; and as the words have gone forth out of my mouth, even so shall they be fulfilled;

Endless Punishment? DC 18

18:1d And surely every man must repent or suffer, for I God am endless; wherefore, I revoke not the judgments which I shall pass, but woes shall go forth, weeping, wailing, and gnashing of teeth;

18:1e yea, to those who are found on my left hand; nevertheless, it is not written that there shall be no end to this torment; but it is written endless torment.

18:2a Again, it is written eternal damnation; wherefore it is more express than other scriptures, that it might work upon the hearts of the children of men, altogether for my name's glory;

Endless Punishment? DC 18

18:2b wherefore, I will explain unto you this mystery, for it is meet unto you to know even as mine apostles.

18:2c I speak unto you that are chosen in this thing, even as one, that you may enter into my rest; for, behold, the mystery of godliness, how great is it?

18:2d For, behold, I am endless, and the punishment which is given from my hand is endless punishment, **for Endless is my name;** wherefore--

18:2e Eternal punishment is God's punishment. Endless punishment is God's punishment.

18:2f Wherefore, I command you to repent, and keep the commandments which you have received by the hand of my servant Joseph Smith, Jr., in my name;

Endless Punishment? DC 18

18:2g and it is by my almighty power that you have received them; therefore I command you to repent--repent, lest I smite you by the rod of my mouth, and by my wrath, and by my anger, and your sufferings be sore--how sore you know not! how exquisite you know not! yea, how hard to bear you know not!

18:2h For, behold, I, God, have suffered these things for all, that they might not suffer, if they would repent; but if they would not repent, they must suffer even as I;

18:2i which suffering caused myself, even God, the greatest of all, to tremble because of pain, and to bleed at every pore, and to suffer both body and spirit, and would that I might not drink the bitter cup, and shrink;

CONSIDER WHAT DC 76 ACTUALLY SAYS:

1. This revelation ultimately indicates that during the Millennium (i.e. after the first resurrection), there are people on earth who can dwell in God's presence (i.e. 'Celestial') and people who can not abide the Fullness yet (i.e. 'Terrestrial').

CONSIDER WHAT DC 76 ACTUALLY SAYS:

2. It also describes a group who spend the thousand years away in the Prison House, but those who repent receive 'glory' in the end. Those do not suffer eternity outside of God's presence.

CONSIDER WHAT DC 76 ACTUALLY SAYS:

3. :Glory", as described in Section 76, simply describes the state of those at the resurrection during the <u>Millennium.</u>

For a generation, Saints have read the passage too quickly, assuming it described conditions and separate places in eternity, which it does not.

Take Home Points:

- "The Glories" mentioned in DC 76 <u>describe the</u> <u>conditions</u> of people who come forth during the Millennium:
- 2. Celestial 'bodies' are people who have already been transformed and can dwell in the presence of the Father.

Take Home Points:

- 3. <u>Terrestrial</u> describes people who have not yet been transformed bodily, and can not abide the fullness of the Father (in his Spirit) but can the Son (in his flesh)
- 4. <u>Terrestrial and Celestial people occupy the Earth</u> <u>during the Millennium simultaneously.</u>

Take Home Points:

- 5. Telestial people are in the prison house during the Millennium.
- 6. Those who repent are freed at the resurrection of the UnJust.
- Those unrepentant are doomed to suffer the 'Second Death'--eternity away from God.

Final Observation from the Book of Mormon

The Book of Mormon is the Fullness of the Gospel.

Interestingly, the Book of Mormon <u>does not include</u> <u>any of the words Celestial, Terrestrial or Telestial</u>.

Final Observation from the Book of Mormon

According to the Book of Mormon, The final state of mankind is to dwell in the presence of God or be cast out.

Wherefore, the final state of the souls of men is to dwell in the kingdom of God, or to be cast out because of that justice of which I have spoken; --1 Nephi 4:61

We have not read DC 76 carefully.

- Mormonism notions crept in.
- You will feel upset because of pictures painted in your mind for a generation
- If you read DC 76 in context, Celestial, Terrestrial telestial from DC 76 are descriptions of the state of people living in the millennium, nothing more. It is NOT a description of Eternity, when read in context. IF these conditions exist after the final judgement, this is not the scripture that describes it, and don't know where that scripture exists if it does.
- Not asking you to 'accept a theory' or my opinion. I am just saying 'read it in context' and you will understand.
